2. On 05.08.2012 a One Day Intercollegiate Workshop on ‘EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION AND LIFE SKILLS’ on various topics like art of anchoring, secrets of communication, secrets of personality development and art of debate and how

to face interview was held. This session was conducted by Mr. Vinay Nayak, the Chairman, Meverick Institute of Spoken English, Hubli. Students from various colleges of Hubli, Dharwad, Alnavar, Kundagol, and Gadag participated in this workshop. This workshop was inaugurated by Dr. S.V.Bhat, Rtd H.O.D of English, JSS College Dharwad. It was presided by Dr. Rajeshwari Maheshwaraiah, Vice principal, KAC Dharwad.

3. On 25.08.2012 a session on 'TECHNIQUES OF CONCENTRATION' was conducted by Dr. A. R. Yardi, which was followed by practicing some techniques and interaction with students.
4. On 01.09.2012 a special and unique session on 'THE ART OF PHOTOGRAPHY' was arranged. Mr. Anand Bhat, of Nisarga Videos Dharwad, was a Resource Person.
5. On 15.09.2012 a session was arranged on the topic 'STRESS MANAGEMENT AND POSITIVE ATTITUDE'. It was conducted by Mr. Prashant Jadenavar, an MBA in HR and Ex member of CRSF, who is presently working with an NGO at Bangalore. He gave many tips on managing the stress in one's day to day life.
6. On 22.09.2012 a session on 'JIJNASA' was organized. Many arts students usually lack in scientific knowledge in day to day activities. To create an awareness about the scientific attitude, the students of B.Sc final year, were asked to present papers.
7. On 27.09.2012 a group discussion was arranged on the topic 'RESERVATION FOR WOMEN IN PARLIMENT DOING NO GOOD' and 'THE MISUSE OF FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION BY MEDIA IN INDIA'. There was heated discussion on the first topic. Since group discussion plays very important role in learning process, students were asked to actively take part in it in the future days.
8. On 19.01.2013 a unique experiment was made wherein a student who is aspiring for being a Journalist, was invited as a speaker. He is studying in Kadasiddeshwar College, Hubli, and has published number of articles on social problems. He spoke on the topic 'IMPORTANCE OF READING BOOKS'. It was interesting for students because it was being received on the same wave length! It was followed by an interaction with the speaker.
9. On 02.02.2013 another innovative experiment was done. A session on 'CREATIVITY' was organized. It was a session run mainly by the students. They were asked to write the word CREATIVITY in different ways. All the students came out with wonderful ways of writing this word. After that they were given photographs and were asked to analyse them and give titles to them. Next item was introducing them, without using their name

This session proved that, if the students are given freedom to use their creativity in a constructive or positive way, they create wonders and learn more meaningful ways.

They were informed about the mistakes they do while reading. i.e., pronunciation, pauses, intonation, speed and pitch of voice.
